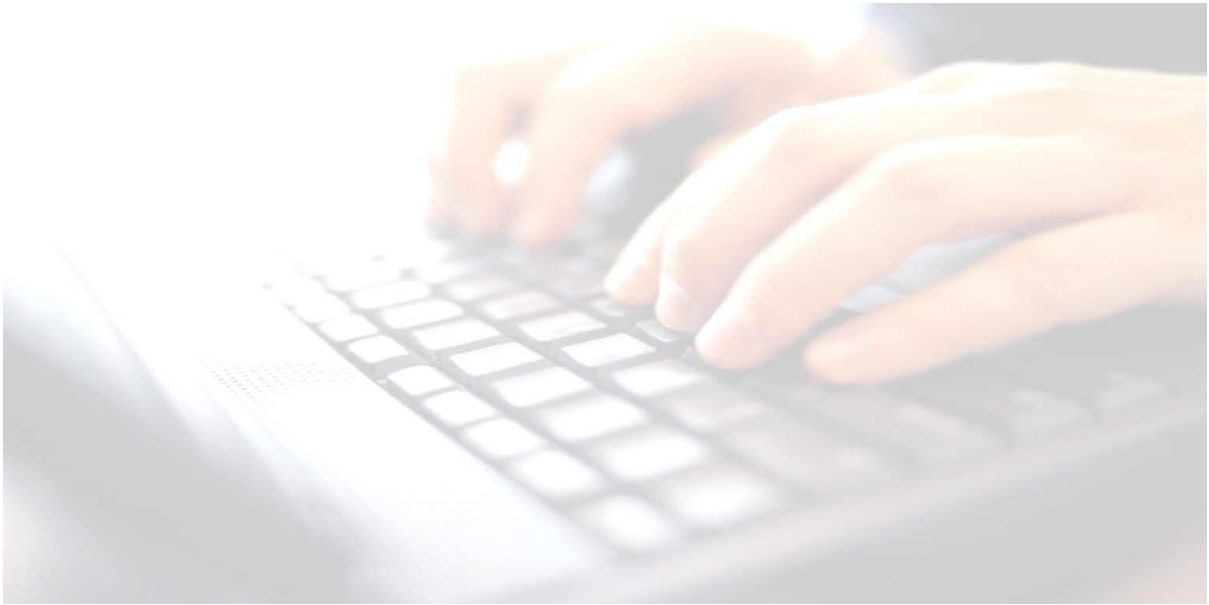




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## Producing Reports for Parents/Guardians

For our example, we are using Key Stage 1

1. The Membership **From** and **To** date fields default to today's date and display pupils who are currently on-roll.
2. To include pupils who have left, the dates will need to be altered. This can be done either directly by entering the dates in dd/mm/yyyy format, or click the calendar buttons adjacent to the required field and select a date from the displayed calendar.
3. If you make changes to the date range, click on **Refresh**  This will then pull leavers through to the **Student** panel below

## Producing Reports for Parents/Guardians

	<p><b>Preview Reports</b> - Highlight required report, <b>select 1 pupil</b> (The first pupil on the list is always selected by default.)</p> <p>Click on the <b>Preview</b> icon. This allows you to view the layout of the report. Once produced to screen, the report can also be printed from this option.</p> <p>This option is also useful to print one copy of the <b>School/National Comparative</b> reports and then photocopy for the rest of the Parent/Guardians. These reports do not contain any pupil details.</p> <p>See Individual Key Stage report tables below for further advice on printing Comparative reports.</p>
	<p><b>Print Reports</b> - <b>Select All pupils</b> and click on the <b>Print</b> button</p> <p>This does not produce the report to screen for viewing, the <b>Print</b> option sends the report straight to the printer. <b>See note below.</b></p> <p><b>NB:</b> Be aware, if your printer prints double-sided and you are printing pupil/s report which are single-sided, you may have the next pupil on the back of another pupil's report.</p> <p>If the reports printed are only single sided, change the settings on your computer Some of the key stage reports have more pages included than others.</p>
	<p><b>Export Reports</b> - <b>Exports</b> to an external file or saved on the computer on a different drive. Only use this option, if you are happy that there will be no changes to pupil/s marks in the Key Stage marksheet, as changes can be made here but will not be updated in SIMS.</p> <p>However, if there aren't any changes to be made to reports, then they may be exported and saved as a pdf format to email to Parents/Guardians.</p>
	<p><b>Upload Reports to pupil/s record</b> - Highlight required report <b>Select All pupils</b> and click on <b>Generate</b>. This will put a copy of the report on the pupil's record under <b>Linked Documents</b>. Once uploaded to the Linked Documents of pupil/s records will be read only</p>





It will produce a page displaying the school's test and teacher assessments for 2023 and the national picture for 2022. (This is based upon data available in September 2022).

This report shows the data as discrete values, where the achieved score is shown with the high score value subtracted from it. Therefore, rows will total 100% - subject to rounding.

**Phonics screening check information and results**

**What is the phonics screening check?**

The phonics screening check is a quick check of your child's ability to decode words using only his or her phonic knowledge. It helps us to confirm whether your child has met the expected standard for a child at the end of Year 1.

The check is a statutory requirement for all children in Year 1 and takes place each year in the summer term. Children who did not take the check in Year 1, or who did not meet the expected standard, will take the check again at the end of Year 2.

The check is carried out in the Summer term.

**How does the check work?**

- Your child was asked to read 40 words aloud to a teacher who is known to him/her.
- Your child may have read some of the words before, while others would have been completely new.
- The check took only a few minutes to complete and there was no time limit.

**Meeting the expected standard**

In order for children to demonstrate that they have met the expected standard in phonic decoding they had to score a minimum number of marks in the phonics screening check. Children who scored fewer than the minimum threshold are considered not to have met the expected standard in phonic decoding. Any child who has not met the expected standard will be given additional support in phonics to help him or her to improve. The nature of this support will vary depending on how close to the threshold he/she was.

**What happens next if your child did not meet the minimum standard?**

Your child will continue to learn phonics with his/her classmates on a daily basis. The screening check is designed to help teachers identify which children need help with phonic decoding. Depending on his/her learning needs, your child may be given additional resources or input. In addition to the daily phonics session in class, your child may take part in additional catch up sessions throughout the week.

Your child will take the phonics check again at the end of their time in Year 2, so that the school can make sure again that the support and help given to your child has been successful, or is continuing appropriately.

**Can I help my child with phonics?**

Children make the best use of their understanding of phonics when they are given plenty of encouragement and learn to enjoy reading a wide variety of books and other forms of writing. Parents play a very important part in helping with this.

Some simple steps to help your child learn to read through using phonics successfully:

- Ask your child's class teacher about the school's approach to teaching phonics and how you can reinforce this at home. For example, the teacher will be able to tell you which letters and sounds the class is covering in lessons each week.
- When reading, encourage your child to 'sound out' unfamiliar words and then blend the sounds together from left to right, rather than looking at the pictures to guess the word. Once your child has read an unfamiliar word you can talk about what it means and help him/her to follow the story.
- Try to make time to read something with your child every day and encourage other family members and friends to do the same. Support your child to blend the sounds together all the way through a word.
- Keep reading all the time, wherever you are, including the school holidays when children don't have a home reading book from school. Look for as many opportunities as possible to encourage your child to use the skills they are learning – menus and leaflets and on-screen text can stimulate children to want to practise their phonic knowledge.
- Word games like 'I-spy' can also be an enjoyable way of teaching children about sounds and letters as can talking about all the words which surround you, from road signs to shopping lists. If children become aware of the uses of reading, they become much more interested in practising what they know.

**Scaled Scores**

Scaled scores are used all over the world. They help test results to be reported consistently from one year to the next. The national curriculum tests are designed to be as similar as possible year on year, but slight differences in difficulty will occur between years. Scaled scores maintain their meaning over time so that two pupils achieving the same scaled score on two different tests will have demonstrated the same attainment. On the scale 100 will always represent the 'national standard'. However, due to the small differences in difficulty between tests, the 'raw score' (ie the total number of correct responses) that equates to 100 might be different (though similar) each year.
